

Visit to Guatapé, known for its colorful facades and *zócalos* (decorative panels that portray scenes, symbols, and elements of everyday life as part of a local traditios)

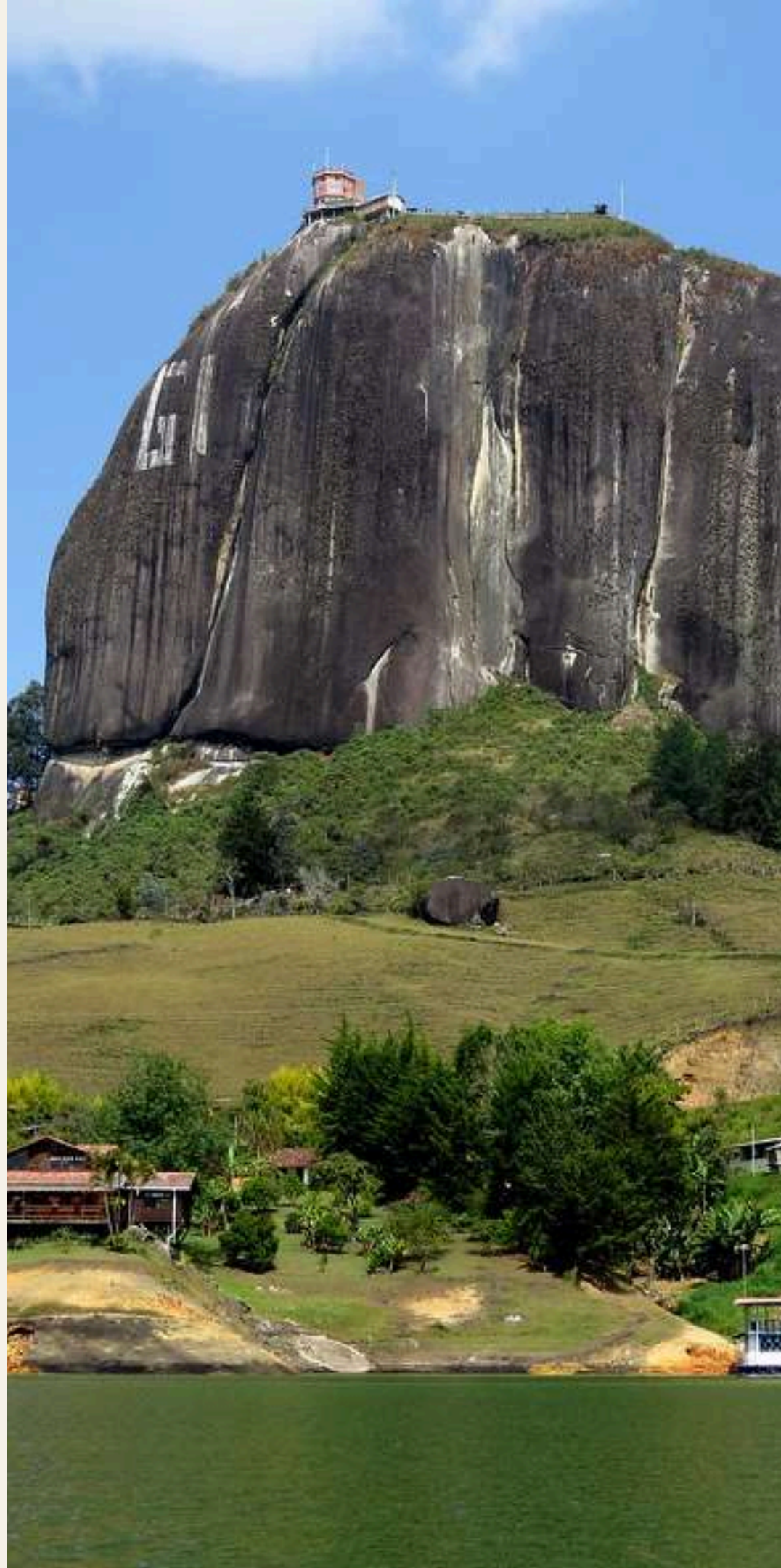
Climb to El Peñol Rock and time to take in the landscape of mountains and reservoirs.

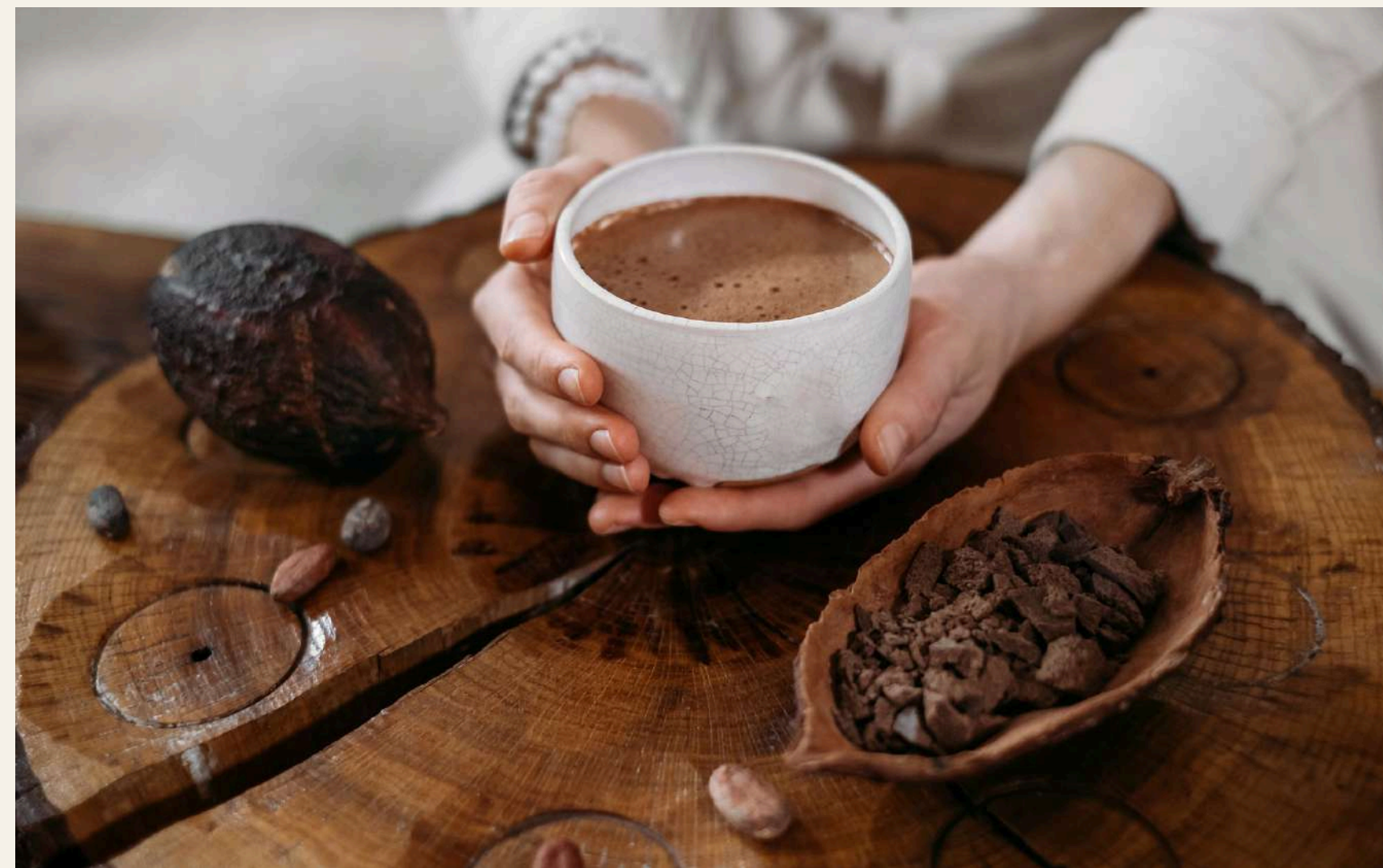
The Path to Chocolate
