Program

Day 1: Arrival & Cultural Introduction

Arrival at Mérida International Airport. Welcome by the local team and transfer to the hotel. Group welcome dinner and introduction to the program.

Day 2: City, History & Culinary Workshop

Exploration of Mérida's historic center to understand its colonial heritage and contemporary cultural life. Gastronomic experience with an interactive cooking class as a tool for cultural learning.

Day 3: Maya Heritage & Cacao

Guided visit to the archaeological site of Uxmal, one of the most representative Maya cities in the region. Afterwards, a cultural experience at Choco Story Uxmal, focused on the history of cacao and its cultural significance.



Program

Day 4: Hacienda, Productive History & Nature

Visit a historic estate dedicated to henequen production. Introduction to traditional productive processes, followed by time immersed in nature, including a visit to a cenote.

Day 5: Natural Reserves & Colonial City

Exploration of Ría Lagartos Biosphere Reserve, a protected natural area that offers insight into the region's biodiversity. Visit to the distinctive pink landscapes of Las Coloradas, followed by transfer to the colonial city of Valladolid for overnight accommodation.

Day 6: Maya World & the Caribbean

Guided visit to Chichén Itzá, one of the most representative archaeological sites of Mesoamerica. Transfer to the coast and arrival at Isla Mujeres, including general orientation and supervised free time.



Program

Day 7: Marine Ecosystem & Program Closure

Island day featuring coastal exploration at Playa Norte. Optional activities such as snorkeling or supervised beach time. Farewell group dinner and final reflection on the educational experience in Isla Mujeres.

Day 9: Departure

Transfer to the airport and conclusion of the program.
