



Mexico: from its cultural heart to the Yucatán Peninsula

From Mexico City to Yucatán

Program

Day 1: Arrival in Mexico City

Arrival and transfer to the hotel. A first introduction to the city, where its rhythm and energy begin to set the tone for the journey.

Day 2. Mexico City: history and culture

Exploration of the historic center, home to some of the country's most emblematic landmarks. Continue to Coyoacán to visit the Casa Azul, Frida Kahlo's former home, offering insight into her life, work, and context.

Day 3: Teotihuacán & living traditions

Visit to Teotihuacán to explore its main structures and understand its historical significance. In the afternoon, experience Xochimilco, where tradition and everyday life continue along its canals.



Program

Day 4: Mexico City → Guanajuato

Journey toward the Bajío, where the landscape shifts and gives way to cities with a different sense of time. Guanajuato is discovered through its alleys, plazas, and distinctive architecture.

Day 5: Guanajuato → San Miguel de Allende

Transfer to San Miguel de Allende, a city best explored on foot, where cobblestone streets, colonial facades, and a vibrant cultural scene come together. Its history and architecture have made it one of the most iconic destinations in the Bajío.

Day 6: Bajío → Mérida

Flight to southeastern Mexico. Arrival in Mérida, the capital of Yucatán, where the climate, architecture, and pace mark a new chapter of the journey.

Day 7: Mérida: culture and tradition

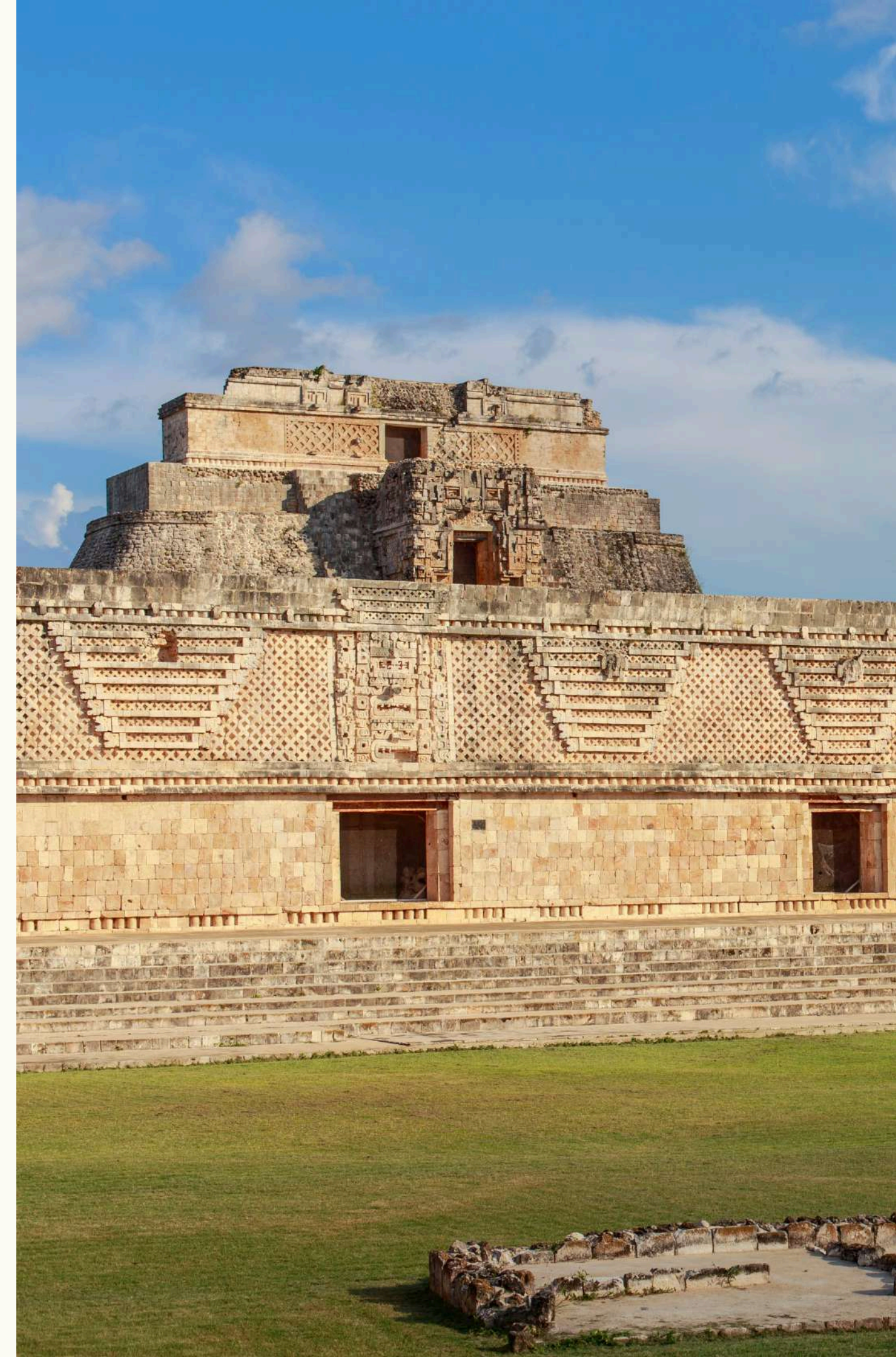
Exploration of Mérida's historic center, with its plazas and buildings reflecting the city's past. In the afternoon, visit a traditional henequen hacienda, key to the region's economic and social history.

Day 8. Mérida: local experience

A day to experience the city through its everyday life: markets, gastronomy, and spaces that reflect Yucatán's local culture.

Day 9. Puuc Route: Uxmal and Kabah

Visit to Uxmal and Kabah, two of the most representative sites of the Puuc style, where Mayan architecture stands out for its detail, geometry, and connection to the natural environment.

Day 10: Izamal & Chichén Itzá

Visit Izamal, a town defined by its color and history. Continue to Chichén Itzá, one of the most significant centers of the Mayan world.

Day 11: Cenotes & Valladolid

Experience the cenotes of the peninsula, natural formations deeply connected to the region's geography and beliefs. Arrival in Valladolid, a town with a calm and traditional atmosphere.

Day 12: Ek Balam & Río Lagartos

Visit Ek Balam, an archaeological site that offers a more intimate experience. Later, Río Lagartos reveals mangroves, wildlife, and coastal ecosystems.



Program

Day 13: Río Lagartos → Tulum

Journey toward the Caribbean coast, where the landscape gradually shifts between jungle and sea before reaching Tulum.

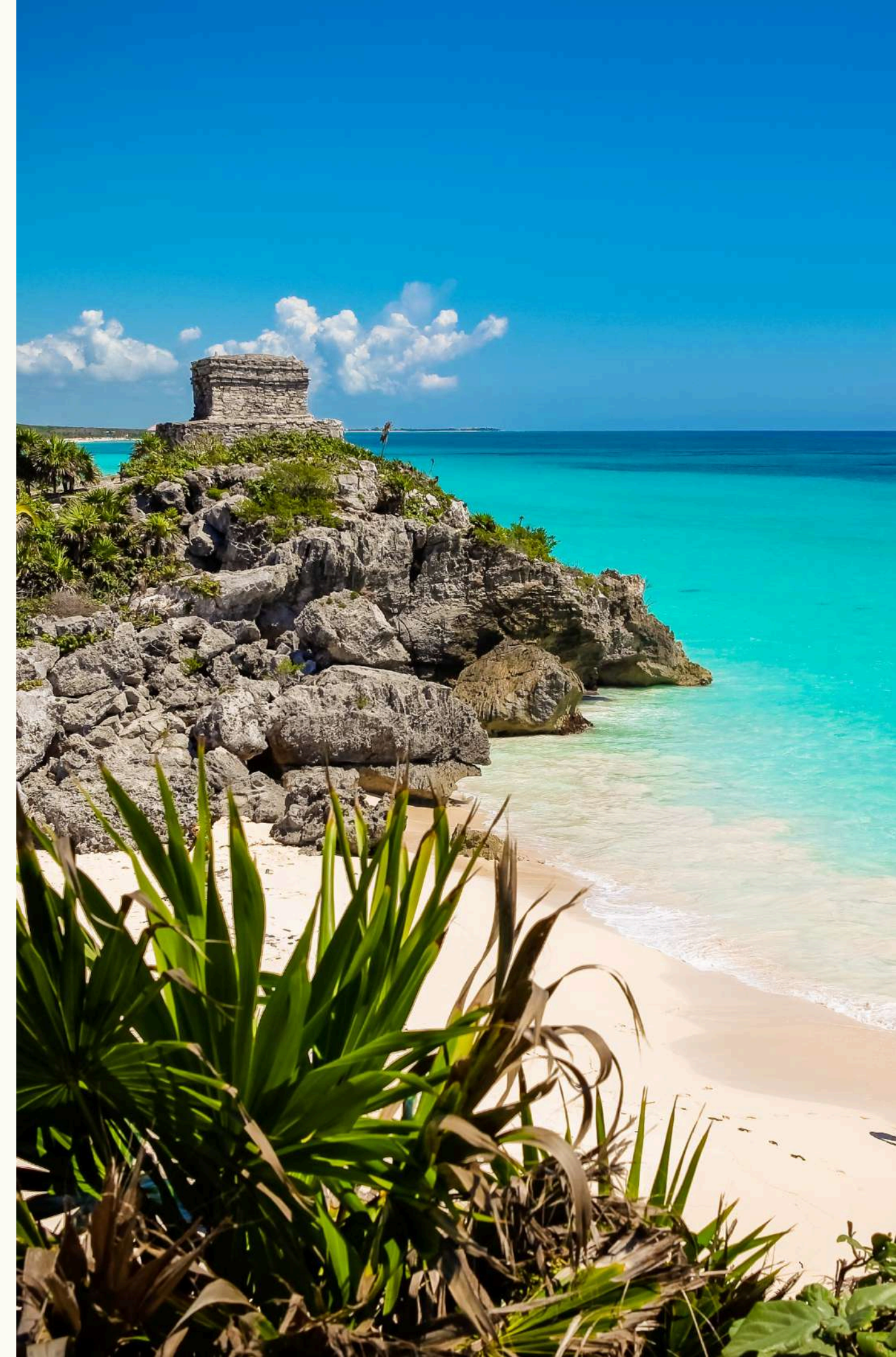
Day 14: Mexican caribbean
