Program

Day 1: Arrival and Integration


Arrival in Cancún and transfer to Mérida. The group is welcomed by the local team and introduced to the program. Integration with host families and first cultural immersion experience in the daily life of Yucatán.

Day 2: History, City, and Community

Guided tour of Mérida's historic center to explore its colonial heritage, architecture, and cultural life. Volunteering activity at a local community institution. Interaction and cultural exchange with host families.

Day 3: Mayan World and Colonial Cities

Visit to the archaeological site of Chichén Itzá, with an introduction to Mayan civilization and its historical legacy. Cultural tour of the city of Valladolid, exploring its architecture, traditions, and local life.



Program

Day 4: Nature and territory

Exploration of the region's cenotes. Hands-on experience in the natural environment and understanding of the relationship between landscape, local communities, and culture.

Day 5: Language, Learning, and Cultural Closing

Immersion day at a Spanish school, combining language classes with cultural activities. Group interaction and closing activity with the students.

Day 6: Tradition, Gastronomy, and Heritage

Visit to the archaeological site of Uxmal. Traditional cooking class with a Mayan family in a local community. Cultural experience at the Choco Story museum, focused on cacao and its historical significance.



Program

Day 7: Archaeology and Coast

Exploration of the archaeological site of Cobá and visit to Tulum, where archaeological heritage blends with the natural beauty of the Caribbean. Transfer to Playa del Carmen.

Day 8: Marine Nature and Conservation

Orientation tour in Playa del Carmen and snorkeling experience in Akumal, observing sea turtles in their natural habitat and reflecting on marine ecosystem conservation. Group farewell dinner.

Day 9: Departure

Transfer to the airport and conclusion of the program.
